

Dual Control ADI FAQs

ADI Part 2 test

The Approved Driving Instructor (ADI) Part 2 test is the second step in the three-step process to become a driving instructor. This test involves the hirer driving the dual control car with the examiner as a passenger, testing them on various points.

Hiring parameters - The hirer can collect the car on their own if they can produce proof of test time/date. Minimum length of hire is 1 hour and the maximum is 4 hours. The hirer can also hire the car in advance on their own for a maximum of four hours (either in one block or in four blocks of one hour, etc.)

ADI Part 3 test

The Approved Driving Instructor (ADI) Part 3 test is the third step in the three-step process to become a driving instructor. The test involves a DVSA examiner observing the hirer as they give a one-hour lesson to a pupil. The pupil can be a learner or full licence holder. They cannot be an approved driving instructor (ADI) or someone else who is preparing to take the ADI Part 3 test.

Hiring parameters - The hirer must collect the car with their learner and we must see both licences and proof of test date/time. Minimum length of hire is 1 hour and the maximum is 4 hours. The hirer can also hire the car in advance with their learner for a maximum of four hours (either in one block or in four blocks of one hour, etc). Please note, passengers cannot be carried in the learner car during lessons but the examiner will sit in the back of the car during the test.
